

#### Create An Impressive Float In 5 Simple Steps!!

It is not too early to start thinking about ideas for a FLOAT for July 27, 2013 Fun Daze Parade. Here are some basic instructions to help you in that regard.

This years Theme is "Blue Skies and Butterflies" and we hope everyone can participate... The Ishpeming Blue Notes, Superior Pipes Band, Negaunee City Band and Ahmed Shriners, Lil Truckers, etc. have all been booked for this Summer and it should be a spectacular parade!!!

 #1 - Cover the float platform with plywood for durability. You will also need a hammer, nails, heavy duty stapler
 #2 - Apply the contour to give your float the desired shape

#3 - Staple or tape the floral sheeting to the platform of the trailer. Then finish the sides with a solid apron framework to prevent wind from pocketing underneath and tearing the materials
#4 - Staple the fringe to the lower portion of your float. Staple twist over the top of the fringe to hide its tape Heading. Also use the twist to outline backgrounds or as Contrasting trim between colors.


#5 - Apply the letters and props to the float



# Traveler Safety Tips Source: American Hotel & Motel Association

Don't answer the door in a hotel or motel room without verifying who it is. If a person claims to be an employee, call the front desk and ask if someone from their staff is supposed to have access to your room and for what purpose. When returning to your hotel or motel late in the evening, use the main entrance of the hotel. Be observant and look around before entering parking lots.

Close the door securely whenever you are in your room and use all of the locking devices provided. Don't needlessly display guest room keys in public or carelessly leave them on restaurant tables, at the swimming pool, or other places where they can be easily stolen.

Do not draw attention to yourself by displaying large amounts of cash or expensive jewelry. Don't invite strangers to your room. Place all valuables in the hotel or motel's safe deposit box. Do not leave valuables in your vehicle. Check to see that any sliding glass doors or windows and any connecting room doors are locked.

If you see any suspicious activity, please report your observations to the management.



"I made it my cause:' she said. "You have to have the desire to make a difference." Being immersed in the world of parental abuse is a far cry from Galvez's own upbringing.

"My life was so Brady Bunch growing up," she said.

Her parents were together, and she grew up in the same house her entire life. Once she started working with child protective services, she discovered a world completely foreign to her but felt the call to help.

In Great Falls the need is immense. "It's epidemic around here," Galvez noted. She said it spiked two years ago. "We went from not a lot of places to we can't meet the needs." "I was sick to my stomach wondering, 'Where are these kids going to go?'" she said. So she became a foster parent and has had her foster children for 15 months.

Galvez believes part of the uptick is because people are more vigilant after 2-year-old October Perez suffered fatal injuries by her mother's boyfriend in 2011. She also believes an increase in drugs and alcohol use, as well as a tight economy, has put atrisk parents those who might not have the tools to deal with stressful situations - in a greater hind.

Part of the goal of Child and Family Services, which works closely with the Children's Receiving Home. is to provide the parents with resources and skills to bring the family hack together.

"I've seen success with parents. Parents that have embraced the learning experience, ' she said. "You want to empower parents."

But she's also witnessed those who've struggled and who haven't been able to rise above their circumstances. In these situations, sometimes the best outcome is for the children to stay with foster parents or to he adopted by a loving family.

The goal is to break the cycle of abuse because it's generational.

In the 20 years Galvez has been involved with abused children in Great Falls, she's seen instances where the grandmother, mother and, ultimately,

the child passed through the Receiving Home's doors.

If they can improve the life of a child, it causes a positive ripple effect for the next generation, but it's a long road.

They can house tip to 14 children at once at the Great Falls Children's Receiving Home. Many of these are larger sibling groups since they're more difficult to place without splitting up into foster homes. Galvez said it's important to keep them together since they're often dependent upon each other, often with the older ones assuming the responsibility as the caretaker.

She said they've had 5- and 6-year olds who have diapered infants, put siblings to sleep and generally cared for the needs of the younger ones because that's what they were used to doing.

"Some of these kids are pretty good little parents," she noted.

But it's heartbreaking because they were never allowed to experience childhood, she added. Their goal at the Children's Receiving Home is to relieve the burden so these hyper-responsible kids can be kids.

Galvez takes her role very seriously since her most important role in life is being a mother.

"You want (the parents) to see how precious their child is, and how much of a gift it is being a mom," she said.

And her heart goes out for the children who see abuse as normal. "I want to give these kids a chance. I want to show them what life has to offer; see that a kid realizes that life is pretty good."

The best outcome is when the parents can be motivated to improve the situation. If not, thankfully, there are people willing to step up. She's quick to point out that fostering abused children is not for everyone, but for those who choose to open their heart and home to a child in need, it can make a world of difference.

"Everyone is cut out for something different," she said. "You have to have a love for kids, and you have to have a heart."

It is not a path to monetary wealth, but helping the most innocent members of the community creates an abundance of riches for the soul.






